Opportunities Available

We believe that the opportunity to set meaningful personal goals and to achieve a greater degree of independence is important to everyone. The Kevil Center offers each participant a number of choices to help them do that. Every employee, along with guardians or caregivers, is an important part of the planning process.

What would you like to do? Are you looking for an employment situation? We offer training and assistance designed to help people find and maintain employment in the community. We also provide opportunities for work in our Center.

Maybe learning basic skills that enhance daily living is what is most important to you. Or maybe you want to learn about and participate in the local community.

Providing such a variety of services and tailoring each plan to a specific person requires a dedicated and prepared staff. Rest assured that safety and supervision responsibilities are not taken lightly. Staff receive regular training that includes First Aid, CPR, dealing with seizures, crisis prevention, medications, communicable diseases, forklift operation, and other areas as required by specific jobs.

Staff to persons served ratios vary from program to program, but are always maintained at a level adequate to ensure safety and meet mandates from funding sources. No fees are charged for our services.

Some of Our Programs

JOBs [Job Opportunity Builders]

This program concentrates on helping you get the skills you need to work at a job in the community. We can help you find job openings, prepare resumes, and set up interviews. Our Supported Employment program is designed for those who may need a little extra support. We will continue to work with you as long as you might need or want our support. In some cases we can even provide a coach to help you learn the new job.

Medicaid Waiver Programs

We are licensed providers of Day Training (DT) services and Supported Employment services under the Supports for Community Living Waiver (SCL) and the Michelle P Waiver (MPW). These are programs provided through Kentucky Medicaid.

Work Services

We do work for several companies in our area. Jobs might include assembling small parts, packaging, recycling, etc. You do get paid for the work that you do in our program.



Non-Work Services

Not all services are centered around work. You may choose from a variety of classes and activities designed to promote independence and self-enrichment. There are volunteer sites where a person can help others in the community. Field trips and other outings provide opportunities to participate in community events. Classes could include topics such as Basic Education or Budgeting. Other classes may stress personal skills such as communication, independent living, grooming, or nutrition.

Activities available at the Center on a regular basis include utilizing the internet, as well as making cards or writing letters on the computer.

We have different exercise classes here and at the YMCA; and we go to The Funky Monkey in Draffenville for Arts and Crafts classes, as well as in our Center.

Sometimes there are special events such as movies, sporting events, museums, theater and lunches out with friends. You can help plan your program just like ordering from a menu.
